Things to Do



Walking

Visit Malahide Castle and walk its vast grounds. Or if you'd prefer a coastal walk, our sandy beach can be enjoyed all year around and the coastal walk extends from the village to Portmarnock with lovely sea views along the way. You can also walk and birdwatch along Malahide Estuary.

Watersports

Malahide Castle and Demesne

This castle was built in the 12th Century by the Talbot family, who remained in residence until 1975. There are many period rooms on view and the castle contains the National Portrait Collection of the National Gallery of Ireland. The Demesne has pleasant walks, play and picnic areas, a cricket pitch, tennis courts, 9-hole golf course and a pitch and putt course. Also within Malahide Demesne lie the Talbot Botanic Gardens, home to over 5,000 different species of plants.

Visit the Fry Model Railway collection, a working railway of unique handmade train models which is one of the world's largest miniature railways (covering 2,500 sq ft). The courtyard accommodates craft workshops and Tara's Palace, a spectacular display of dolls, antique toys and doll's houses.

History of Malahide

There has been a settlement at Malahide (Mullach Íde, which is Gaelic for Hill of the Hydes) since ancient times. The Vikings landed in 795 AD and the Danes settled here from 897 AD. In 1185 the Normans took control of Dublin with the first buildings that would become Malahide Castle being constructed shortly afterwards. The Castle remained in use until 1975 when it's control and that of its surrounding estate was bequeathed to the State and has since been available as a public park.



The village based around its current centre developed in the early 19th century and the small harbour was used to import coal and timber. Flax was grown locally and the stain that it left on walls as it was being dried gave its name to the area of the town still known as "Yellow Walls". The Grand Hotel was built in 1835 in anticipation of the arrival of the railway which connected to Malahide in 1844. This, along with the development of the Malahide Sea Baths, located then behind the Grand Hotel, put Malahide on the map for visitors from Dublin and beyond.

Malahide started to develop into the town that it is today with the first speculative housing estate being built in the late fifties. Since then it has grown to a population of over 20,000. Malahide is a very popular spot with Dubliners and tourists alike and is renowned for its fashionable pubs, restaurants, coffee shops and a wide range of shopping, especially clothing. The Grand Hotel has likewise grown to be a major conference centre and a base for visitors availing of its beach, marina and a wide range of sporting activities in the immediate vicinity.
